Notes:

The Convention was followed by the "Protocol on Liability and Compensation for Damage Resulting from the Transboundary Movements of Hazardous Wastes and their Disposal", which aims at creating a comprehensive system of adequate and prompt liability and compensation for damage resulting from the transboundary movements and disposal of hazardous wastes and other wastes, including illicit traffic in such waste.

Although adopted since 1999, the Protocol has yet to be entered into force as it has been signed by only 11 of the 181 members of the Convention.
