	The Kyoto Protocol established three mechanisms to assist States mentioned in Annex I to meet their commitments. These are known as the "Kyoto Flexible Mechanisms" the emissions trading mechanism, the joint implementation mechanism and the clean development mechanism.
	The Protocol was subject to two amendments, the first to Annex B in November 2006 and the second to Doha in December 2012.
	Neither has entered into force.
